From the Archives - 34 years Ago:

"Rough Rider Industries, a division of the North Dakota Correctional Institution, dispersed its entire Gelbvieh herd in Bismarck on Feb. 18. Sixty purebred bred cows averaged \$2455.

Two females brought down the gavel at \$3,100. Al Gustin, Bismarck, selected a 1985 daughter of Floto II bred back to Ranger. Fastenau Farms, Bertrand, Neb., came back and bought a polled purebred 1986 Hockeye daughter. She sold bred to LNR Nobility."
